Snow tasks- activities for school closure days.

1. Capture the winter scene.

Take a photograph or draw a picture of the winter scene on your street.

Use your observational (careful looking) skills to make your drawing detailed and realistic. If you are taking a photo try to make the composition interesting. Try to show perspective too.

2. What's in the news? Cut out or print off an interesting news article about the weather this week. It could be from a newspaper or from the internet.

Read your news article and make sure you understand all the vocabulary (use a dictionary or ask an adult). Be prepared to share it with your classmates when we return.

3. Topic research.

You can always do some extra research for our class topic. Term 2= Europe and Term 3= Victorians. Make notes, draw pictures and try to explain what you have been learning about in your own words.

4. School reading books.

If you are off school more than one day due to bad weather, please read the next 10 pages of your school reading book. If you have finished your book write a paragraph to summarise the story.

5. All pupils should practise their times tables.

Test yourself by covering up the answers to see how quickly you can say all the stations. E.g. 3,6,9,12,18 etc.

Make up a bingo game to play with people at home. Be prepared for a times table challenge when you return to school.
